Notice: 2023 Major Contributor Reporting Period (Biennial School / Coordinated Election)

The reporting period for major contributor reports as it relates to the November 7, 2023 Biennial School/Coordinated Election begins on **Sunday, October 8, 2023 and runs through Monday, November 6, 2023**. Section 1-45-108(2.5) C.R.S., requires the filing of major contributor reports **no later than twenty-four (24) hours after receipt** of a major contribution. A major contribution is defined as a contribution, including loans (this includes candidates making loans or contributions to their own committee), of \$1,000 or more at any time within **30 days before a** primary, general, or **regular biennial school election**.

The major contributor report is due in addition to regularly scheduled contribution and expenditure reports. The TRACER system will automatically generate a major contributor report upon entry of a qualifying contribution into the system. Data entry of qualifying contributions into TRACER should be completed on the day they are received to avoid late penalties.

For your convenience, several contribution scenarios have been included below. These scenarios can be used as a guide in determining whether or not a major contributor report is required by law. This applies to:

- ALL issue committees
- ALL candidate committees whose office appears on a 2023 ballot
 - Note: A candidate contributing/loaning \$1,000 or more to their own campaign will trigger a major contributor report that must be filed

This does NOT apply to:

- 527 Political Organizations and Independent Expenditure Committees
- Political parties

Contribution Scenarios

Scenario 1: Contributor X gives you a \$1,250 contribution via check on October 2nd and you deposit it on October 3rd; are you required to file a major contributor report? If so, when is the report due?

Answer: No major contributor report is due because the contribution was not received or deposited within 30 days before the regular biennial school election.

Scenario 2: Contributor Y gives you a \$1,050 contribution via check on October 10th and you deposit it on October 11th; are you required to file a major contributor report? If so, when is the report due?

Answer: Yes, a major contributor report is due because 1) the contribution was \$1,000 or more and 2) date received/deposited was within 30 days before the regular biennial school election. The report is due no later than 24 hours after the received date input into TRACER for the contribution.

Note: The below reference chart is for determining the date of a contribution per Campaign and Political Finance Rule 10.4:

Contribution Type	Acceptance Date
Check	The date the check is received at the earliest, or the deposit date at the latest. If the committee receives a donation by check or money order within five business days before the end of a reporting period, the committee must deposit or return the contribution before the end of the reporting period (Rule 10.4.1)
Cash	The date cash enters the committee's possession (Rule 10.4.2)
Credit card, PayPal, or other intermediary service	The date the contributor or donor authorizes the payment, or if unknow, the date the payment intermediary transfers the contribution or donation (Rule 10.4.3)
Non-monetary (in-kind)	The date the contribution or donation enters the committee's possession, or the date the committee has the right to possess or use the item (Rule 10.4.5)
Any other contribution type	The date the contribution or donation is accepted (Rule 10.4.7)

Scenario 3: Contributor Z gives you a \$900 contribution via check on October 11th and you deposit it on October 12th; are you required to file a major contributor report? If so, when is the report due?

Answer: No major contributor report is due because the amount contributed is less than \$1,000.

Scenario 4: Contributor V gives you a \$400 contribution on October 16th and then a \$750 contribution on October 25th; are you required to file a major contributor report or reports? If so, when is the report or reports due?

Answer: Although Contributor V contributed more than a \$1,000 within 30 days before the regular biennial school election, no single contribution was equal to or greater than \$1,000; therefore, no major contributor report is required.

TRACER View

When you save a major contribution, you'll get a *Warning* message (see below); click on the *Continue Save* button to save the contribution. Please thoroughly read the message for important information.




A confirmation that the contribution was successfully recorded is displayed. Once the contribution has been recorded, you'll need to go file the report.



To file the Major Contributor Report, go to the *Reports Due* grid on the *Overview* tab, or *File Reports* tab and click on *View/File*.



To file, click on the red File button.



You'll receive a message the report was successfully submitted; click the red Finished button.



The report will now be shown as filed under the *Filing History* grid on the *File Reports* tab. The report is also now available for public review.
