Fiscal Summary of Initiative 112

This fiscal summary, prepared by the nonpartisan Director of Research of the Legislative Council, contains a preliminary assessment of the measure's fiscal impact. A full fiscal impact statement for this initiative is or will be available at leg.colorado.gov/bluebook. This fiscal summary identifies the following impact.

State expenditures. The initiative increases state expenditures in future fiscal years to house offenders for longer periods in Department of Corrections facilities instead of releasing them on parole. According to data from the Department of Corrections, on average about 449 offenders per year are sentenced to prison for the offenses identified in the initiative and are on average sentenced to 12 to 24 years in prison. Actual costs will depend on the change to an offender's length of stay, which are subject to numerous factors and cannot be estimated. For informational purposes, it currently costs \$56,972 per year to house an offender in a state run prison and \$8,387 per year to supervise an offender on parole. Since the measure will apply to offenders convicted after the measure's passage, impacts on the correctional system are not anticipated before the mid-2030's, based on the average sentences for these offenses.

Economic impacts. Longer prison sentences will reduce workforce participation, which may reduce economic activity from labor and spending and may increase government spending on prisons and social welfare programs. To the extent that the initiative decreases criminal activity, those otherwise impacted by crime may experience better economic outcomes.
