Dear Secretary Williams:

The Administrator of the Uniform Consumer Credit Code is requesting that certain statutory citations contained in the Code of Colorado Regulations be corrected pursuant to the newly enacted House Bill 17-1006, which added subsection (11)(l) to C.R.S. §24-4-103 providing the following:

- (l)(I) An agency may request the secretary of state to correct a statutory citation contained in a rule, including a form incorporated into a rule, as published in the code of Colorado regulations if:
 - (A) The general assembly has relocated the statute in a manner that renders the rule's citation to the statute inaccurate; and
 - (B) The agency submits to the secretary a written determination by the attorney general that finds that the condition specified in subsection (11)(I)(I)(A) of this section applies, specifies what the correct citation is, and identifies each citation that should be corrected.

The general assembly also enacted House Bill 17-1238, Concerning the Nonsubstantive Relocation of Laws Related to Debt Management and Collection Services from Title 12, Colorado Revised Statutes, as Part of the Organizational Recodification of Title 12. This recodification Act renders the rules' citations to the statute inaccurate, and, therefore, the condition specified in C.R.S. § 24-4-103(11)(I)(I)(A) applies.

The citations that need to be corrected and the corrections are enclosed.
