Dear Vanessa and Suzanne,

In an effort to eliminate any confusion regarding the location of the town of Bonanza records, I thought it would be beneficial to give you an update. In searching for the records, I was initially informed by Mr. Ashley and his son that the town records had been delivered to Mr. Ben Gibbons office. After receiving a copy of Mr. Gibbons response on the matter, I informed Mr. Ashley and his son of Mr. Gibbon's indication that his office did not possess those records. They then informed me that it was Mr. Ashley's daughter that had delivered the records and that I ought to contact her. In doing so, she informed me that she had unsuccessfully attempted to deliver the records to the county but that the county had refused to receive them. I then asked if she knew where the records were being stored and she said that she didn't recall as it had been so long ago. She suggested that I speak with her mother as she might know their whereabouts. When I subsequently spoke to Mrs. Ashley she also had a hard time recalling where the records might be.
