



STATEMENT OF SUFFICIENCY

April 16, 2014

On March 31, 2014, Republican gubernatorial candidate Bob Beauprez submitted 23,000 petition signatures to the Secretary of State. The candidate seeks nomination by petition to the June 24, 2014 primary election ballot. Under Colorado law, Mr. Beauprez's petition must contain at least 1,500 valid signatures from each of Colorado's seven congressional districts, for a total of at least 10,500 valid signatures statewide.¹
