



STATEMENT OF SUFFICIENCY

April 20, 2016

On March 28, 2016, Republican U.S. Senate candidate Jack Graham submitted 22,786 petition signatures to the Secretary of State. The candidate seeks nomination by petition to the June 28, 2016 primary election ballot. Under Colorado law, Mr. Graham's petition must contain at least 1,500 valid signatures from each of Colorado's seven congressional districts, for a total of at least 10,500 valid signatures statewide.¹

¹ Under section 1-4-801(2)(c)(II), C.R.S., a major party statewide candidate petition requires signatures from "at least one thousand five hundred eligible electors in each congressional district"
