

## Questions and Concerns for Bingo and Raffle Games Rules 8 CCR 1505-2

Page 2 of 13, line 22: is there an “or” since (iv) was deleted?

Page 7 of 13, line 19:

“to select one of the envelopes.” My concern is that there may be games played where the winner could select more than one card. If for example the game is played where each winner selected two or more envelopes.

Page 8 of 13, line 23:

I looked and could not find “Rule 8.1.4”.

Page 9 of 13, lines 1, 2 and 3:

“In a playing card progressive raffle, the licensee must award the jackpot to the ticket purchaser whose ticket is first drawn after the prize limit is reached.” If I understand this rule, it means the purchaser of the winning ticket does NOT have to open an envelope to win. Example: The \$15,000.00 jackpot has been reached and there are ten envelopes left unopened. Could the winner be decided by opening the correct envelope; the first winner would be allowed to open a predetermined number of envelopes, if it was not the correct envelope another name would be selected and that person would be allowed to open an envelope, this would go on until the correct envelope was opened?

Page 10 of 13, Rule 9.3.3(b):

(1) This means the Games Manager must have \$500.00 available. This would require a bank be made up for each occasion containing at least \$500.00. I don’t believe this is necessary.

(2) If the drawing is held on Friday night this rule means the jackpot would have to be paid out by Sunday night. In the case of my Lodge, two signatures must be on the check

May be easier if it is paid within “five business days” instead of 48 hours.

(4)(iii) If a deck of cards is used, there are no manufacturer’s serial and/or identification numbers located on the winning card.
