- 3. While the rules remain difficult to read (it truly is a labyrinth), I appreciate your efforts to make them less so.
- 4. I am most truly grateful for the following addition, which will help to ensure that the presidential electoral college fulfills the wishes of the majority of voters:
- 24.2.1 AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 1-4-304 (5), C.R.S., EACH PRESIDENTIAL ELECTOR MUST VOTE FOR THE PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATE AND VICE-PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATE WHO RECEIVED THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF VOTES AT THE PRECEDING GENERAL ELECTION IN THIS STATE.
- 5. If you have not already begun the process, I implore you to enforce the inclusion of the most recent five years' worth of Federal and State tax returns as part of every presidential and vice-presidential candidate's application, in order for their names to appear on Colorado's presidential ballot.
