I understand there are some activist concerns around these measures, and I have not had a chance to evaluate those concerns any more than I have the proposed rules.

As there is no election imminent (aside from some possible local issues around the state), would it be possible to request a delay in the enaction of the new rules until some of these concerns can be addressed and--if necessary--resolved?

Voting is critical to the American system, and doing it as accurately as possible with an eye to reducing confusion is absolutely necessary. Even just a few weeks to allow some concerns and confusion to be ironed out would be the difference between some very frustrated citizens and some satisfied ones.
