To whom it may concern:

On April 23, 2018, Governor Hickenlooper signed into law House Bill 18-1025, Relocate Title 12 Liquor Laws to Title 44. House Bill 18-1025 serves the purpose of relocating the statutory provisions governing the Department of Revenue, Liquor Enforcement Division ("LED"). Specifically, effective October 1, 2018, House Bill 18-1025 relocates: the Colorado Liquor Code, formerly located in Article 47 of Title 12, to Article 3 of Title 44; the Colorado Beer Code, formerly located in Articles 46 of Title 12, to Article 4 of Title 44, and the provisions regarding special event liquor permits, formerly located in Article 48 of Title 12, to Article 5 of Title 44 (collectively "Colorado Liquor Laws"). The relocation of these statutes renders all references to the Colorado Liquor Laws within 1 CCR 203-2 no longer accurate. As a result, the proposed correction is to update all statutory references to the Colorado Liquor Laws contained in 1 CCR 203-2 with the statutory citations contained in Title 44, Articles 3, 4 and 5, effective October 1, 2018.

Pursuant to section 24-4-103(11)(l)(I)(B), C.R.S., the corrections to 1 CCR 203-2 are occasioned by the General Assembly's relocation of the Colorado Liquor Laws, and such corrections meet the conditions specified in section 24-4-103(11)(l)(I)(A), C.R.S. Attached to LED's filing is a version of 1 CCR 203-2 containing these corrections. As noted in the comments to the filing, a conversion table and a redline version are also available, if needed.
