1.2 Licensure by Endorsement

The purpose of this Rule is to clarify licensure by endorsement requirements pursuant to section 12-20-202(3), C.R.S.

- A. To qualify for licensure by endorsement an applicant must:
 - 1. Possess an active license in good standing to practice as a hearing aid provider in another state or ~~territory of the~~ United States ~~territory or in a foreign country~~; and

1.12 REQUIRED DISCLOSURE TO PATIENTS – CONVICTION OF OR DISCIPLINE BASED ON SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

- E. A ~~provider need~~ ~~licensee is~~ not ~~make the required to provide the written~~ disclosure ~~required by this section~~ before providing professional services to the patient ~~in if any of~~ the following ~~instances applies~~ as set forth in section 12-~~32~~-115(4), C.R.S.:
 - 1. The patient is unconscious or otherwise unable to comprehend the disclosure and sign an acknowledgment of receipt of the disclosure pursuant to section 12-30-115(3)(d), C.R.S., and a guardian of the patient is unavailable to comprehend the disclosure and sign the acknowledgement;
 - 2. The ~~patient~~ visit occurs in an emergency room or freestanding emergency department or the visit is unscheduled, including consultations in inpatient facilities; or
 - 3. The ~~provider who will be treating the patient during the visit~~ ~~licensee providing the professional service to the patient~~ is not known to the patient until immediately prior to the start of the visit. ~~or~~
- F4. ~~A provider who~~ ~~The licensee~~ does not have a direct treatment relationship or have direct contact with the patient is not required to make the disclosure required by this section.
