1 Current 8 CCR 1505-11 is amended as follows:

- New Rule 2.4 requires a notary public to inform their customer, prior to performing a notarial act, of any service that is an additional charge to the notarial act and to provide an itemized invoice of each specific
- 4 charge and informs of the consequences of failing to abide by the new requirements:

2.4 ITEMIZATION OF CHARGES

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- 6 2.4.1 IF A NOTARY PUBLIC CHARGES FOR ANY SERVICE IN ADDITION TO THE NOTARIAL ACT, THE NOTARY PUBLIC MUST:
- 8 (A) INFORM THE CUSTOMER OF THE CHARGES BEFORE PERFORMING THE NOTARIAL ACT; AND
- 10 (B) PROVIDE AN ITEMIZED INVOICE THAT LISTS EACH SPECIFIC CHARGE.
- 11 2.4.2 If A NOTARY PUBLIC FAILS TO ITEMIZE SPECIFIC CHARGES, THE AMOUNT CHARGED IS PRESUMED
 12 TO SOLELY COVER THE NOTARIAL ACT. IF THAT AMOUNT EXCEEDS THE STATUTORY FEE LIMIT IN
 13 SECTION 24-21-529, C.R.S., THE INVOICE IS PRESUMPTIVE EVIDENCE OF A VIOLATION OF THE
 14 REVISED UNIFORM LAW ON NOTARIAL ACTS.
