2012-2013 Regulatory Agenda Summary of Progress

The Colorado Department of Corrections made significant progress toward completing all regulatory goals outlined on the 2012-2013 Regulatory Agenda. While not every rule proposed was adopted; many critical changes were completed.

Highlights of the Department's achievements this past year include:

- Revisions to multiple existing Administrative Regulations (ARs) and creation of several new ARs to ensure compliance with the Federal PREA standards.
- Creation of a Residential Treatment Program AR to provide guidance for the department in effectively managing and providing treatment to offenders with Major Mental Illness.
- Creation of an Open Records AR and process to streamline public access to Departmental records.
- Modification of existing ARs to include guidance to employees and the public regarding CDOC open meetings pursuant to C.R.S. 24-6-402(2)(d)(IV).
