SUBJECT: Proposed initiative measure #108, concerning valuations for assessment

Section 1-40-105 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, requires the directors of the Colorado Legislative Council and the Office of Legislative Legal Services to "review and comment" on initiative petitions for proposed laws and amendments to the Colorado constitution. We hereby submit our comments to you regarding the appended proposed initiative.

The purpose of this statutory requirement of the directors of Legislative Council and the Office of Legislative Legal Services is to provide comments intended to aid proponents in determining the language of their proposal and to avail the public of knowledge of the contents of the proposal. Our first objective is to be sure we understand your intent and your objective in proposing the amendment. We hope that the statements and questions contained in this memorandum will provide a basis for discussion and understanding of the proposal.

This initiative was submitted with a series of initiatives including proposed initiatives 2023-2024 ##107 and 109. The comments and questions raised in this memorandum will not include comments and questions that were addressed in the memoranda for proposed initiatives 2023-2024 ##107 and 109, except as necessary to fully understand the issues raised by the revised proposed initiative. Comments and questions addressed in those other memoranda may also be relevant, and those questions and comments are hereby incorporated by reference in this memorandum.

Purposes

The major purposes of the proposed amendment to the Colorado Revised Statutes appear to be:

- 1. To change the valuation for assessment for all taxable property, excepting residential real property, producing mines, and lands or leaseholds producing oil or gas, to twenty-four percent of the actual value of the property, for property tax years commencing on or after January 1, 2025;
- 2. To change the valuation for assessment for residential real property to five and seven-tenths percent of the actual value of the property for property tax years commencing on or after January 1, 2025;
- 3. To require the state to reimburse local districts for revenue lost as a result of the proposed initiative's changes to valuation for assessment; and
- 4. To ensure that any reduction in state revenue resulting from the proposed initiative does not reduce funding for the department of education.

Substantive Comments and Questions

The substance of the proposed initiative raises the following comments and questions:

- 1. Article V, section 1 (5.5) of the Colorado constitution requires all proposed initiatives to have a single subject. What is the single subject of the proposed initiative?
- 2. What will be the effective date of the proposed initiative?

Technical Comments
