

MISSION STATEMENT OF THE PILOT ELECTION REVIEW COMMITTEE

1. The Pilot Election Review Committee will:
 - a. Develop a methodology to evaluate each of the temporarily approved voting systems used in county pilot elections during the 2015 Coordinated Election in a fair and objective manner.
 - b. Develop methods and forms to obtain feedback regarding system performance from various stakeholders with an interest in Colorado's future voting system(s), including county election officials, election judges, poll watchers, political parties, and voters (including those who are disabled persons).
 - c. Evaluate the performance of the competing systems during the pilot elections according to the methodologies the committee adopts, and recommend to the Secretary of State the voting system(s) that should be certified for use by Colorado counties beginning in 2016.
2. The following activities and subjects are outside the scope of the Pilot Election Review Committee's mission:
 - a. Temporary approval of voting systems pursuant to section 1-5-619, C.R.S., and Election Rule 21.6, including:
 - i. Receiving applications for temporary approval from interested providers;
 - ii. Determining whether the applications and supporting technical data packages (TDPs) are complete;
 - iii. Assessing whether the proposed systems substantially comply with the 2002 Voting Systems Standards and Colorado's specific requirements, or if additional testing is required;
 - iv. Approving test plans for any additional testing required;
 - v. Reviewing final test reports;
 - vi. Issuing temporary approvals for specific systems, and authorizing specific counties to use them, subject to such conditions as the Secretary of State deems appropriate.
 - b. Legislation and rules pertaining to the manner in which elections are conducted in Colorado.
 - c. Legislation and rules pertaining to voter registration, or functionalities of the statewide voter registration database (SCORE).
