



STATEMENT OF SUFFICIENCY

April 9, 2014

On March 27, 2014, Republican gubernatorial candidate Tom Tancredo submitted 16,634 petition signatures to the Secretary of State. The candidate seeks nomination by petition to the June 24, 2014 primary election ballot. Under Colorado law, Mr. Tancredo's petition must contain at least 1,500 valid signatures from each of Colorado's seven congressional districts, for a total of at least 10,500 valid signatures statewide.¹

¹ Under section 1-4-801(2)(c)(II), C.R.S., a major party gubernatorial candidate petition requires signatures from "at least one thousand five hundred eligible electors in each congressional district"
