STATEMENT OF SUFFICIENCY

Proposed Initiative 2017-2018 #108 "Just Compensation for Reduction in Fair Market Value by Government Law or Regulation"

August 28, 2018

On August 3, 2018, the designated representatives of 2017-2018 Proposed Initiative #108 ("Just Compensation for Reduction in Fair Market Value by Government Law or Regulation") submitted 209,111 petition signatures to the Secretary of State. Because #108 proposes to change the Colorado constitution, the petition must contain signatures from each state senate district equal to two percent of the total registered electors from each respective district, in addition to meeting the 98,492 threshold.¹
