



**STATEMENT OF SUFFICIENCY**  
 Proposed Initiative 2017-2018 #173 “Campaign Contributions”

September 4, 2018

On August 6, 2018, the designated representatives of 2017-2018 Proposed Initiative #173 (“Campaign Contributions”) submitted 212,332 petition signatures to the Secretary of State. Because #173 proposes to change the Colorado constitution, the petition must contain signatures from each state senate district equal to two percent of the total registered electors from each respective district, in addition to meeting the 98,492 threshold.<sup>1</sup>

<sup>1</sup>Under Article V, Section 1 (2.5) of the Colorado constitution, “a petition for an initiated constitutional amendment shall be signed by registered electors who reside in each state senate district in Colorado in amount equal to at least two percent of the total registered electors in the senate district...the number and boundaries of the senate districts and the number of registered electors in the senate districts shall be those in effect at the time the form of the petition has been approved for circulation as provided by law.”
