Subject: Rule Changes Pertaining to Bingo

To Whom It May Concern,

We currently operate bingo under the TREA Chapter 1 Auxiliary in Colorado Springs and are **opposed** to the changes in the regulations. We are a small operation and would not/could not meet the higher maximums that are proposed. And because we are small, we would not be able to compete with other organizations that can have the maximum payout of \$5000. We have enough volunteers to have one weekly occasion but would not be able to have one 370 times a year. Raising the number of automated cards to 54 implies an increase in rental cost to us that would have to be filtered to our customers who are already complaining about the cost of an automated machine.

The proposed changes would not help increase revenue or attendance in our bingo occasion. The economy is the driving factor in everything in this world. When a player has to make a choice of food on the table, gas in the car to get to work, or bingo, bingo will lose every time.
