SUBJECT: Please do not adopt rule No. 2.1C.

In addition to our Colo State legislature not passing such a bill as was noted in Rule noted above in 2015, the Dept. of Defense National Institute of Standards + Technology finding email voting able to be hacked, therefore not endorsed, our military vote participation is close to 85% or higher. To open the door to fraud in the sake of a small percentage convenience is unacceptable. Voter INTEGRITY should be the purpose of the efforts at the Sec. of State.
