

Voter fraud known instances and possibilities:

- A Boulder County voter who moved out-of-state and whose ballot was voted by someone else and accepted in 2015
- Agents who go from one house to another collecting ballots which may or may not ever be deposited in a ballot box
- People who have been caught collecting ballots in trash bins behind apartments
- People who throw their unwanted ballots in open trash cans in rural post offices
- Unmanned ballot drop boxes whose cameras are turned off over 75% of the time and cannot capture faces of people who are dropping off ballots
- At least one unmanned ballot box has no camera that can be seen
- Unmanned ballot drop boxes which allow people to deposit an unlimited number of ballots in violation of the 10 ballot limit
- People (especially out-of-state students) who may have voted absentee in their home state and then register, receive a regular (not provisional) ballot and vote it here in one day

Signature verification procedures

- Training by a sheriff's deputy who is an expert in signature verification requires looking at many different things on a signature.
- The SOS office lists 7 different things to look at on each signature.
- During signature verification the judges are told to take no more than 2 seconds on each signature so how can they check 7 different things.
- Some judges tend to pass signatures that should not pass according to the requirements.
- Signatures are being passed automatically by the BITSY machine which has not been tested by the Logic and Accuracy Committee to see if it is accurate.
- Some reference signatures are from touch pads, not written signatures.
