- 1. There should be no need for the holder of a Notary Seal for more than 12 consecutive years to be required to attend a renewal class if no complaints have been lodged against such person in that same period of time.
- 2. No person who has been previously convicted of a felony or a class 2 misdemeanor or higher in the 7 years (whether in Colorado or in any other jurisdiction) prior to applying for a notary certification should be allowed to apply.
- 3. No person lacking at least a high school diploma should be permitted to be certified as a notary.
- 4. No person who has not been a citizen of the U.S. for at least 3 years or who has entered the U.S. from any country declared by either Executive Order or Homeland Security to be a threat to national security interests should be permitted to apply unless the latter person is first cleared by a background check through Homeland Security.
- 5. No person who is in arrears in the payment of either child support or maintenace should be allowed to apply.
- 6. No person who belongs to or is otherwisse affiliated with any organization declared to by either Executive Order or Homeland Security to be a potential threat to national interests should be granted notary certification.
