**Subject:** Comments - working draft Election rules

I would like to make a few suggestions.

One, I want to know, that when I vote on an item that if I vote yes, it is yes and no it is no. I feel the language of proposed ballot issues must be worded clearly and not try to manipulate voters by making a yes no and a no yes.

Two, in regard to visually impaired individuals and other disabilities, an mp3 or recorded document, must be mailed out to all voters who have notated that they have a disability, weeks before the election. Possibly, as soon as the printed materials are available an mp3 should be made immediately. Someone, should read the printed materials on to an mp3 file and distribute the files via email, usb drive or disk. This will ensure all voters who have a disability are aware before the election of proposed issues, measures and candidates. They must be read in an unbiased manner, just the way the documents are written.

Three, in regard to judges, there should be a way to learn how the judge votes and an option of voting against their reelection, if voters don't agree with how the judge rules. Currently it seems, that judges who are unopposed are reelected without any regard to the desires of the voters. It must be reworded to vote yes or no for a judge to be reelected and some way to alert voters who the judge has performed his/her duties as judge.

I may not be explaining this last issue well, but, allow voters to know how a judge has voted in the past and if they do not receive enough votes, they can be replaced with another judge of the voters choice.
